## Specific Practices to Establish, Maintain, and Restore Positive Relationships with Students

| EMR Phase | Rationale | Intentional Relationship Practices |
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| Establish | The aim for the establish phase is to engage in intentional practices to <br> cultivate a positive relationship with the students. When a teacher establishes <br> relationships with all students, they feel connected, safe, and respected. <br> When this is in place, students are most likely to learn, engage in desired <br> behaviors, and respond to your attempts to correct their behavior. A teacher <br> cannot maintain a relationship she does not have, so it is essential to first <br> establish relationships with your students. | $\circ$ |
| Maintain | The aim for the maintain phase is to sustain the quality of an established <br> positive relationship with students over time by intentional implementing <br> maintenance practices. Research has shown that the quality of relationship <br> can diminish over time because people take one another for granted (ignore <br> good behavior or miss opportunities to reinforce the person) and may <br> unintentionally become more negative by paying more attention to problem <br> behavior. | $\circ$ |
| Restore | The aim for the restore phase is to intentionally repair any harm to the <br> relationship once there has been a negative interaction between the teacher <br> and student. This is important because negative interactions can weaken the <br> relationship and correspondingly cause the student to be less engaged in <br> class, harder to correct their problem behavior, and more challenging to <br> motivate to take on increasingly more difficult academic tasks. As such, <br> teachers must intentionally re-connect with the student to restore the <br> relationship back to its previous positive state. | $\circ$ |
